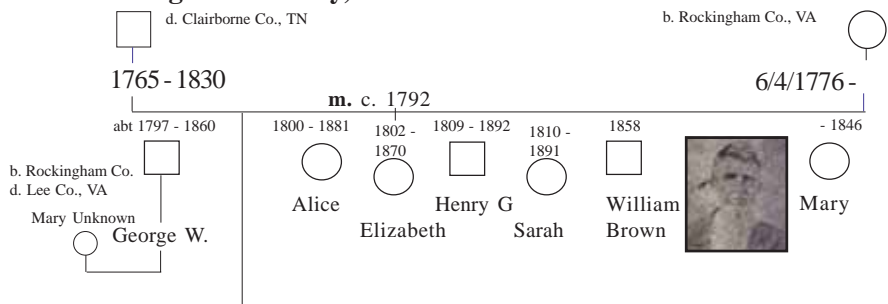


Richard was overseer for Fulton at Liberty Hall, Virginia for seven years. During the War of 1812 he joined the Light Horse Brigade Company and marched to Richmond, Virginia. When they arrived they found that peace had been declared. He served one month and assisted in removing the Indians. He went to Johnson County, Tennessee with his father and family in 1816. He was a farmer, stockman, coroner, Justice of the Peace and was in the legislature at Knoxville. His farm was the original Donnelly Homestead on Wilson Creek one and half miles north of what is now Mountain City, Johnson County, Tennessee. Once he rode 400 miles on horse back to Vigo County, Indiana to see his son, William A. Donnelly, stayed for two days and rode back home.



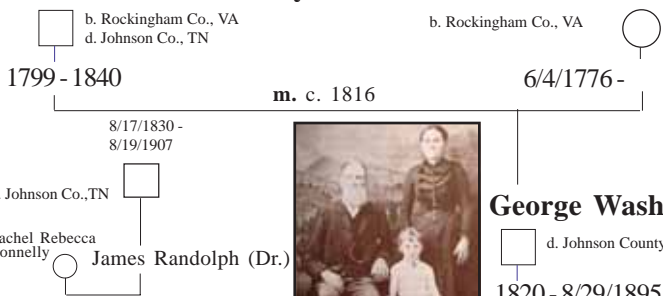

### George W. Morley, Sr. Mary Margaret Brown



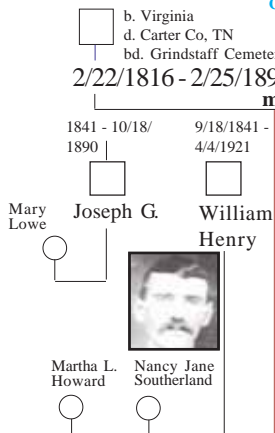
In 1802 George W. Morley witnessed a deed between Joseph Miller and Robert Donnelly in Wilkes County, North Carolina. In 1803, Robert Donnelly sold to George Morley 135 acres for \$300 in Wilkes County, NC. In 1805 George Morley sold to George Brown 130 acres for \$100 in Wilkes County, NC.

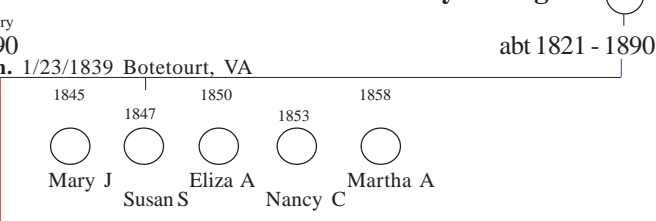
James M. Pleasant was enrolled on September 20, 1863 at Elizabethton in Co. F, 13th Regiment of TN Cavalry Volunteers to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a private on October 28, 1863 at Strawberry Plains, TN in Co. F, 13th Regiment. He contracted Liver disease during his army service for which he was discharged out of the U.S Hospital at Knoxville, TN May 27, 1865. May 1, 1889, there is a record for an increase in Invalid Pension. It stated that he was age 73. In this document it says "The disability for which he is now pensioned has increased since last examined causing total blindness" In his claim for invalid pension, it states that he was attacked with Typhoid Fever in the line of duty at Nashville on May 1, 1864. It says it had attacked his eyes and chest to such an extent as to render him unfit to perform manual labor of any kind. He was 5 feet 6 inches tall, fair complexion, blue eyes and dark hair and by occupation when enlisted was a Carpenter.

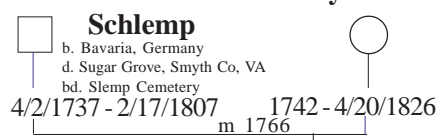


MILITARY: "CPT William Jackson was a member of the North Carolina Militia during the Revolutionary War and was active in protecting the home front in the mountainous region of Western North Carolina. He was considered to be one of the King's Mountain Captains and was one of the "Over the Mountain Boys"; he contributed to Battle of King's Mountain but did not actually fight in the battlefield the day of the battle. It is my opinion that our William was a member of the NC Militia not the Continental Army, and the record Fifteenth Virginia, page 316 has nothing to do with our William Jackson. ---end of quote from Bob Mitchell---

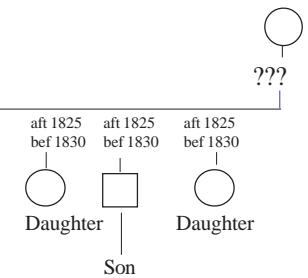

Carson was a very quiet man. He played the piano and stringed instruments. He raised his family during the Great Depression and WWII era. He made his living in various ways: He was constable of Washington County, VA; ran a boarding house in Indiana, and in his later years, drove a taxi cab in Bristol. He died of a heart attack and was buried the day Nellie's youngest daughter was born. (Carson and Fina moved to Indiana a short time after they lost their house to a fire when Nellie was a preschooler. They didn't stay in Indiana long. They moved back to Washington County, VA and lived with Carson's parents in their home just off of Benhams Rd in North Bristol.)

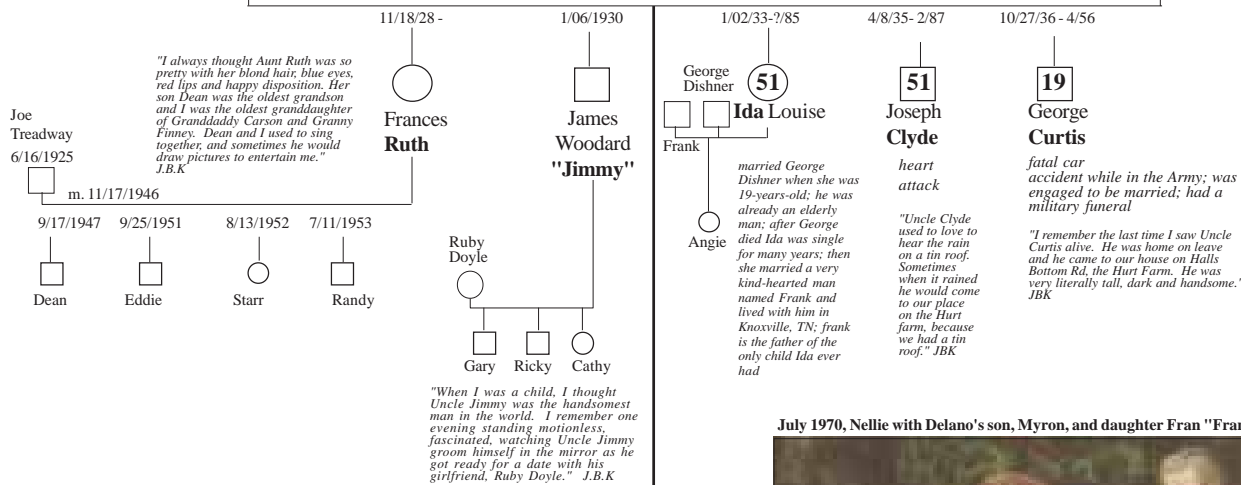
