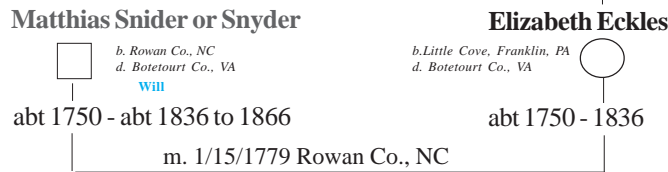
On 4 March 1743, Elizabeth Frey signed her father's deed to her brother Jacob, 4 Mar 1743. There is a statement dated 18 Aug 1735 whereby Johannes Muller acknowledge receipt of ten pounds from Jacob Fry as payment in full of any legacy. So they were married by that date. On 17 Mar 1747, Rev. Michael Schlatter baptized Elizabeth Miller and eight children at Dr. Miller's home. A child had died a few days previously.

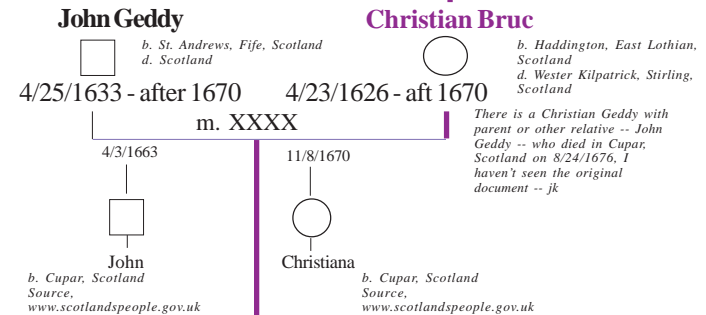
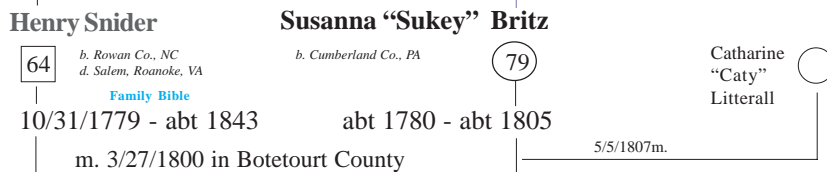
I have several birth/christening records obtained from scotlandpeople.gov.uk indicating that Hendri Geddy is the son of John Geddy and Christian Bruc (notice spelling). Hendri born 1665. William born 1696, son of Henry Geddy (no mother listed). Both were born/christened in Cupar, County Fife, Scotland. I find no marriage records for John and Christian. My notes from other online lineages indicated that John Geddy was Andro Geddy's son. I have a birth record for Andro son of Thomas and Mareone Beams for 1626. And a birth record for John in 1635...there is no way that they are father and son. So I stop with John Geddy and Christian Bruc until someone can find his real parents. I am so confused by all this...even in the official parish records they change the spelling so often my head spins.

Henry was elected to the General Assembly in Botetourt Co. in 1816 -- most of the legislatures were second generation Germans in VA. He was one of the first settlers in Salem, who had removed from the neighborhood of Amsterdam in Botetourt County. He owned a tannery and was the first representative from this county in the State Legislature. His son, Charles L. Snyder, amassed a large fortune in the tannery business.

Rev. Soldier (oldest son) minister of Gospel Bedford VA. Greta Barker Blair's Article (#161) in "Families of Washington Co. and Bristol, Virginia 1776-1996":

**THOMAS O. BARKER AND REBECCA (GADY) BARKER**

[In] August 2, 1977 we called at a farm place of Gordon Barker in Mendota, Virginia. There, preserved in an old ledger, were entries made by Gordon's grandfather indicating his lineage - exactly 100 years earlier to the day, earlier, Edmond, (1837-1908), ninth of nine children of Sherwood and wife Rachel (Lark) Barker, wrote August 2, 1877: "Great grandfather and his wife Martha Snead - Joel settled American Bottoms Thomas and his wife Rebecca Gaddy - Charles Barker - John - Susan - Rachel - Betsy - Polly ... My great, great, grandfather Edward was a cousin to King Charles and a teacher in the Presbyterian High School in London. He died a short time after he came to the Colony. Great grandfather, John Barker, he sold his land to a man named Richman and Richmond City was named after him".

Records of Ed Mitchell (1019 Oakland Dr, Bristol TN 37620): According to a letter from Ed Mitchell to an unknown person: "Your ancestor Sally Rush was a sister to my great-great grandmother, Margaret Mumpower. Old man Billy got mad at both of them for marrying men he did not approve of and quit speaking to both of them - Sally and Margaret. All of the children quit speaking to Billy when he remarried, except William King, who inherited everything when Billy died. He later committed suicide as did his brother Bradley. There was much friction and hatred in the family. The neighbors overlooked it by saying that they were just 'Indians' and that's the way Indians acted." 1860 census lists name as EADES; 1870 census lists as EADS. 1880 census shows William's father b.NC & his mother b.VA. Billy's ages in censuses:39-1860; 49-1870; 58-1880. Billy Eads was part Cherokee Indian according to Ed Mitchell. Billy weighed about 300 pounds and was very strong, according to a descendant at Rush family reunion.



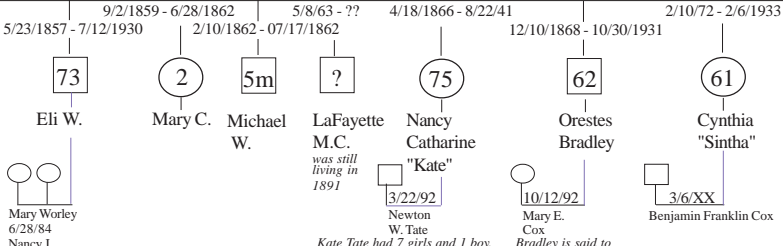
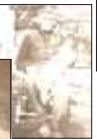
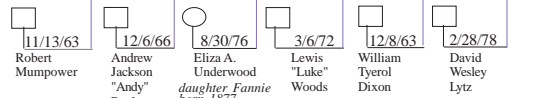

Joseph and Nancy built a Victorian home just off of Benhams Rd on acreage with smoke house, spring house, and other out buildings. When he wasn't at his day job, Joseph was working his tobacco allotment. Nancy tended the gardens and orchard, picked wild blackberries, sewed and preserved food. Nancy was the church secretary for many years. Historical records of Shilah Baptist Church are in her handwriting. Besides raising their own two children, Joseph and Nancy raised Billy Cunningham, Nancy's nephew, whose mother died in childbirth, and Evelyn White, whose mother drowned. This couple had first electricity, telephone and first automobile in the community, according to Nellie Privette.
